Format: Abstracts (in MS Word, 12 point font) should include the following information:

1. Presenter details (names, addresses, email, telephone and fax numbers)
2. Presentation format (oral or poster?)
3. Title (not to exceed 15 words)
4. Abstract (between 300-500 words)
5. Keywords
6. Audio-visual equipment if needed
